s we continue to progress with building the new homes, there has been a focus on naming the new building referred to as Block A, which will house all residents currently living within Darwin House.

On Friday 6 October, Darwin House residents participated in a focus group session with Ward Councillor, Liza Begum to discuss the name of the Block A. The session provided a great opportunity to discuss and review the shortlist of possible building names, as well as receiving and understanding residents' opinions and feedback. Since this project was in its infancy, it has been paramount to the council that residents participate in shaping their future homes, and the naming of block A is a process we wanted residents to lead on.

Following the session, a vote was held amongst Darwin House residents, and winning by a majority with 80% of the total vote, was Darwin House. We are delighted to formally announce the name of Block A as Darwin House and look to the future when this building will become the homes and enhance the lives of our residents.

- Decking and pouring of concrete to 1st, 2nd and 3rd floor is complete
- North elevation concrete pour to the 4th floor is underway
- Substructure brickwork has commenced
- Estimated completion for Block A is Winter 2024

new housing service centre for residents to speak face-to-face with Westminster City Council housing staff has opened on Charlwood Street, Pimlico.

To mark the opening, the Leader of Westminster City Council, Cllr Adam Hug, and Cllr Liza Begum, Cabinet Member for Housing Services, attended a launch along with residents and residents' associations.

Those who attended had the chance to speak with councillors and housing staff to ask questions and understand the wide range of services offered by the new centre. The Charlwood Street centre marks Westminster Council's second office opening in a matter of months following the launch of the Queens Park service centre on the Mozart Estate in June.

Two further housing offices in Bayswater and Soho are being planned following feedback from residents who want housing officers to be closer to the community.
