PROGRESS FROM THE SITE



ince the ground breaking event in April, the site at Balmoral Castle and Darwin House has seen a huge influx in activity.

Piling operations concluded fully at the end of May. Wates undertook this vital piece of work which saw the pile foundations be driven into the ground to form the foundation for the new block. Once the piling rig was safely removed from the site, we welcomed the tower crane into the site boundary, making way for the next part of construction to begin.

Over the past few weeks ground works have been progressing well. The pouring of the ground floor slab has completed, along with the rebar formwork walls being poured. The rebar acts as a reinforcement within the structure of the new building.

The hoarding line has been repositioned slightly to allow for the new access road to Darwin House to be reinstated for use. Keep an eye out for our next issue for further updates from the site.
