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

Domestic abuse is a crime. All people should feel safe. Here at Cranstoun, your safety, mental health and physical wellness is of our utmost concern and our compassionate, experienced and dedicated domestic abuse team are here to support you, your family and your community.

How we help

Domestic abuse can affect anyone. It is non-discriminatory and here at Cranstoun we understand that each case is unique. Cranstoun delivers the Male Victims Domestic Abuse Service in Westminster on behalf of Westminster City Council. We offer a range of immediate safety and support advice emotional support as well as provide a 12 week programme trauma informed programme 'FORTIS'.



Support

Cranstoun work with local organisations, each with unique skills and experience in domestic abuse, allowing us to deliver the best support possible for Westminster residents and community.

We offer early support to male victims of domestic abuse in the community. The service is free and offers practical help, supporting people to manage their lives and wellbeing including those with poor physical or mental health.

We provide ongoing personalised support in order to assist individuals to increase their safety and improve their health and wellbeing outcomes.

Who do we work with

At Cranstoun we are here to help. We are here to empower and we're here to challenge & change abusive behaviour.

We work with male residents in Westminster who are 16 plus, with or without children and affected by domestic abuse.

If this service is not the right fit for you, we will look to sign-post you to other male specific services or look for wider agencies to support your case.

Other services

Services we work alongside to ensure the best provision of support:

Westminster City Council; Statutory providers (NHS, Police); Domestic Abuse service providers; Commissioned support; and Emergency Accommodation providers.
